Officials to report on reforms' results

Peña Nieto announces round of public statements

President Enrique Peña Nieto instructed cabinet members to keep the public informed of the implementation of structural reforms Sunday.

In an effort by the Peña Nieto administration to keep citizens informed of the "country's transformation," the government has opted to publish reform implementation reports presented from the secretariats.

"Mexicans have the right to know the details of the application of changes and federal secretariats should issue regular updates on the process," Peña Nieto said.

The first reports will be published

on the federal government website (www.reformas.gob.mx) from March 9 through 18.

Energy Secretary Pedro Joaquín Coldwell will issue a report on the energy reform's advances March 9.

Communications and Transportation Secretary Gerardo **Ruiz Esparza** will issue a report on telecommunications and broadcasting March 10.

Treasury and Public Finance Secretary Luis Videgaray Caso will disclose information about the financial reform March 11.

Labor and Social Welfare Secretary Alfonso Navarrete Prida will present advances on labor reform March 12.

Public Education Secretary Emilio

Chuayffet Chemor will publish updates on the education reform March 17.

Agricultural, Land and Urban Development Secretary Jesús Murillo Karam will report on housing projects carried out in recent years.

The website that will host the reports from the secretariats also provides information about the importance of structural reforms, explaining Mexico's situation when Peña Nieto came to power.

The federal government's ambitious reform agenda seeks to solve the problems the country has been facing and other issues the nation must confront, the president said.
